Next year Christ Church Primacy will be 40 years old! And as we consider ways to celebrate the existence of the church in this community, we also pause to consider how we want to move forward in the next 40 years.

It would be nice at this point to dazzle you with suggestions of new programmes and ministries. Instead, I offer you a very simple suggestion. We move forward hand in hand with Jesus because without Him, we, as individuals and as a church can do nothing. Moses recognised this truth as he led the Israelites through the wilderness. I paraphrase Moses, using words from Exodus 33:16

*How will anyone know that you are pleased with CCP **unless you go with us**? What else will distinguish CCP from all the other people in Primacy?*

At the end of the month, we enter the church calendar season of Advent. A time to rejoice as we remember the birth of Jesus Christ, *Immanuel*, and simultaneously look to His Coming again. *Immanuel*, meaning *God with us*. His Presence is a gift to us, not only to be enjoyed in December, but every day of the year.

God says in Jeremiah 29:13,

‘You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.’

What an invitation into His Presence! The Lord wants to be found by us. May we at Christ Church be known as a ‘distinguished’ people, because of the presence and power of Immanuel dwelling in our hearts, and in our church, as we come together to worship. May His Presence be palpable, to visitors and worshippers alike.

With that in mind, I invite you, the church, to join me in January for a month of intentional prayer and fasting as we seek God’s Presence, power and guidance for CCP in the year ahead and pray for the community of Primacy.

May God bless every home with His Presence this December.

Remembering

Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

In the last edition of Outreach, we reported on the wonderful celebration we had on Sunday 5 June celebrating with the rest of the nation the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. How sad then, just three short months later, we should mourn her passing. In his Statement on the death of Her Majesty, the Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland, the Most Revd John McDowell wrote,

'All deaths are inevitable, but few are as unimaginable as that of Queen Elizabeth II. She has been on the throne and the stage of public life longer than any person, living or dead. The burden of such a life was rarely visible except when she chose to share her feelings about a particular event or "*annus horribilis*" with a sympathetic public. Mostly when she spoke it was to draw attention to others.' He ended his statement with,

'We thank God for the life of Queen Elizabeth II, for her faithfulness to Him and to her calling, from which we have gained so much. To finish with some words from the first Elizabeth's Golden Speech but which find an echo in the life of Queen Elizabeth II, "... and we do confess that we passed not so much to be a Queen, as to be a Queen of such subjects ... for whom we would willingly lose our life, ere see such to perish. I bless God that he hath never given me this fault or fear; for he knows best whether ever fear possessed me, for all my dangers; I know it is his gift; and not to hide his glory, I say it".

Most, if not all, of us here in Primacy have known no other Monarch and I think it is fitting that we say a final **Thank You** in this issue to Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. She will long be remembered in our hearts as a wonderful servant of the nation and God our King.



Mission Corner

Christ Church has had a heart for mission for many years. Our lead role in **CAP** reaches out to our local communities.

Active involvement in **Christian Aid** week has been and continues to be a chance for many of us to raise funds for Christian Aid.

In addition to collecting funds for the Earl Haig fund every November the parish has been responsive to many emergency appeals and has had many other mission interests over the years.

The Select Vestry wish to raise the profile in support of mission and as a step this year have set aside £600 to support mission. After further discussion it has been agreed that as a parish, we will build links between our parish and Kiwoko Hospital, Uganda and Good News for Everyone (formerly Gideons).

Donations have been sent and we will be hearing more about these organisations in the year ahead.

We hope to have a mission table quiz in February – save the date as **Saturday 25 February**.



May God bless you all for your continued support.





Pastoral Care Outreach


Over the past few months in a variety of ways our Pastoral Care Team have been actively seeking ways to demonstrate God's love to our Church Family.

Small Group training



In early Autumn the Diocese of Down & Dromore held a course to equip church members to lead small groups. The course was held for five evenings in St Ignatius Parish, Carryduff. Tim Parr and Carol

Graham signed up for the course. Tim with his wife Gillian led one of CCP's Exploration Groups and Carol is involved in an inter-church Women's Group.

Josh Hooker, a Crosslinks Mission Partner who has been seconded to work in the Diocese for the next few years, led the sessions. The resources used were the books: 'The Small Group and the Vine' and 'The Thing Is', which were complemented by a video led by Tony Payne and Marty Sweeny around a variety of aspects of leading home groups or growth groups as they called them.

Each week focused on a different topic: Understanding Small Groups; Understanding Your Role As A Leader; Leading People To God's Word; Leading In Prayer, and Persevering With People.

Tony and Marty began by asserting that homegroups were not purely for support. Jesus did not come here to support us but to begin to establish God's kingdom here on earth and so the 'mission' of homegroup leaders is not to make people feel better but to help them move 'to the right' from 'The Domain of Darkness' to 'The Kingdom of the Son'. While there is nothing wrong with support, however the primary objective of small groups is about establishing God's kingdom. This is the difference between the trellis and the vine... the trellis just provides support, but the vine provides this too and enables grapes to grow. When we accept Jesus into our lives, we move from the Domain of Darkness into the Kingdom of the Son, moving further into His kingdom as we mature in our faith.

One of the first exercises was to share our experiences of what we have and have not appreciated about small groups we have been a part of. It was good to hear the views of other participants, and this gave a sound basis for what we needed to take heed of as a leader.

We both found the course to be useful. For Carol, it helped her to deepen her understanding of her journey to the right and to be more confident about what she can contribute. For Tim, it was challenging to reflect on the purpose of our Exploration groups and the role the leader plays. Overall, it was a worthwhile experience which we would both recommend to anyone else who has the opportunity to be part of this programme.




Tots@Primacy



